This involves collecting and distributing donated local food, as well as promoting the use of local food through our Discovery Kitchen project.

Duties & Activities:

- Assist with the management of the Donation Station at any of the following times and locations:
 - Wednesdays at the Athens Farmers Market from 9AM-1PM (May-November)
 - Mondays and Thursdays at the Chesterhill Produce Auction from 3PM-7PM (May-October)
 - Saturdays at the Athens Farmers Market, 9AM-12:30PM (year-round)
- Additional, flexible assignments based on the interests and skills of the chosen intern. May
 include Discovery Kitchen (educational outreach promoting local food), gleaning produce for
 Harvest Hotline, marketing for Grow-A-Row, fundraising, assisting at the Donation Station
 garden plots and attending biweekly staff meetings.

Qualifications:

- Interested in public health and nutrition; interest in cooking a plus
- Energetic, accountable, and reliable
- Ability to contribute individually and participate in a team
- Able to work outside for 6-7 hours and lift 50 pounds
- Passionate about food justice and local food
